SOUTH PHILLY / COMPLEX AREA

This FAQ provides key information to fans and residents who live in South Philadelphia (stadium complex area). It provides guidance about street closures, fan marches, parking, and tailgating on match days.

Perimeter

1. What is the site perimeter and how will the City ensure the additional (foot and vehicle) traffic remains safe for South Philadelphia residents? The perimeter is the same as it is for Eagles games. Throughout the tournament, the City will provide law-enforcement support, traffic control, and emergency medical services on match days around the Sports Complex District and in the surrounding vicinity.

Street Closures

What streets closures might impact on my area? There is one main road closure that will be implemented during match days: 11th Street, from Pattison Avenue to Terminal Avenue, will be closed starting at 7 a.m. on the six match days. Match days are as follows:

Sunday, June 14, 7 p.m.

Friday, June 19, 8:30 p.m.

Monday, June 22, 5 p.m.

Thursday, June 25, 4 p.m.

Saturday, June 27, 5 p.m.

Saturday, July 4, 5 p.m.

2. Could additional closures be added at a moment's notice? Yes, the Philadelphia Police Department may close more roads around the stadium complex if needed for public safety, up to 90 minutes before or after matches. Impacted roads will reopen when safe.

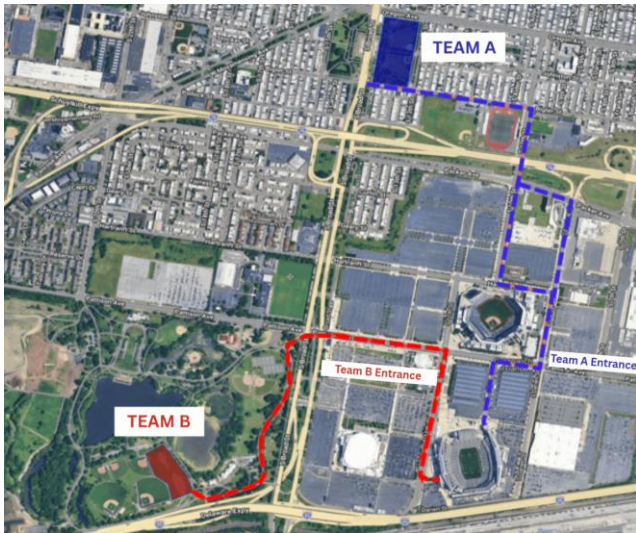
3. Where can I quickly get information about closures? Text **"CUPPHL"** to **888-777** to receive free alerts from the Office of Emergency Management for confirmation of planned fan marches, major road closures, Fan Festival operating changes and other event related details. The City will also share road closure updates with the media. We also suggest you download the **2026 Access Philly App**.

Fan Marches

1. What is a Fan March? Fan marches or "fan walks" are traditional pre-game processions in which supporters from a team parade together from a designated assembly point to the stadium complex.

2. Will the fan marches be permitted on game days, non-game days, or both? The permit will only be for specific hours on game days. The City will try its best to notify a neighborhood where a march will begin hours before the march begins.

3. How will nearby businesses and residential blocks be affected? The fan marches will be a moving event with city provided restrooms and public safety escorts from the Philadelphia Police Department. The City currently anticipates that any road closures will be less than an hour.



4. Are there specific routes for the marches? Yes. There are pre-determined routes for each team depending on the match day):

- Team A fans will start in the east side of **Marconi Plaza Park**, and march to Stadium using **Bigler Street to 10th Street**, then with two variations:
 - On June 14 and 19: Using **10th Street**, crossing **Packer Avenue**, to **Phillies Drive/Hartranft Street**, to **Darien Street**, to **Pattison Avenue**.
 - On June 22, 25, 27, and July 4: **Using 10th Street**, to **Packer Avenue**, to **Darien Street**, to **Pattison Avenue**.
- Team B: fans will start in **FDR Park**, and march to Stadium using **Pattison Avenue to 11th Street**.

Match Day Parking

1. Will the City monitor or direct fan march participants who drive and want to park? No, parking is not included in the permit and is discouraged. All guidance for the Fan Marches encourages participants to use public transportation, walk, or hail a ride to the assembly point.

2. Are there any parking restrictions for Fan March routes? “Temporary No Parking” signs will be posted along march routes, and residents are strongly encouraged to move their vehicles, but are **NOT REQUIRED**.

3. What if I choose to leave my vehicle parked along a march route? Marches will be less than an hour, but during that time, you will not be able to access your vehicle. We strongly advise vehicles to be relocated prior to a fan march to avoid any issues.

4. Can we prevent people who are attending a match from parking in my neighborhood? Neighborhood parking management will be conducted the same way as it is during any major event at the stadiums. There's no official management north of Packer Avenue, but police details will help prevent unauthorized parking.

5. Will people be allowed to drive into and park in FDR Park on Match Days? FDR will be closed on game days. Parking is not permitted in FDR Park on match days. This measure will help alleviate congestion and prevent ticket holders from parking in FDR Park.

Tailgating at the Stadium

1. Will I be able to tailgate at the FIFA Philadelphia Stadium (Linc) on match days? Yes, tailgating is permitted on match days if you have a prepaid parking pass and match ticket. Entry is allowed for up to 5 hours before match begins. No one without a ticket is able to enter the perimeter on match days.

2. Do I need a purchased ticket to enter the stadium complex, even if just to tailgate? Yes. Only those with tickets will be permitted into the lot and only one parking pass may be purchased per match ticket. Without both, tailgaters will be turned away.
